Dear beloved parishioners and guests,

How very exciting this time of year is for both Christians and Jews - a time of great celebration for us all! The feast of Hanukkah or the "Festival of Lights" is commemorated with the lighting of the nine-branched Menorah as a reminder of God's protection and the rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem and we celebrate with them.



We, as Christians throughout the world, celebrate the "birth of Jesus", the central & figure of Christianity. We happily acknowledge God loving us so very much that He sent His only Son to be born a human that we, in turn, could become divine by uniting ourselves through Holy Baptism with Jesus, thus answering the call: "Come, follow Me."

As I celebrate the daily Liturgy and turn to bless you, my heart fills with much warmth and love as I gaze lovingly on the beautiful Icon of the Nativity that now graces our St. Joseph's church and I am ever so grateful for your trust and generosity to make this a special reality – what a delightful preparation for Christmas!

Obviously this Icon (as all icons contain much symbolism and meaning) truly calls forth for a sermon unto itself and this will take place, but bear with me as I share a few notes of explanation for this Icon, respected, loved and adored over the centuries by Ukrainians, Greeks and all Byzantine Christians, (Turn & look at the icon as you read!)

The immense power of God from above breaks into the cosmos of this world to unite the whole universe. The Star of Bethelem, guiding the Wisemen and the Shepherds, brightly shines above the site of Jesus's birth. We witness the new-born child, the baby Jesus, wrapped in swaddling clothes, as if in a death-shroud and placed in a tomb-like crib, as a visible reminder that Jesus, the Son of God, was born for us, lived for us, suffered and even died for us. This is the most "central tenet" of our Christian faith.

The most prominent figure, Mary, the Mother of God, resting on a bright-colored X hammock, is not gazing at her child, but warmly turned to Joseph, who truly is puzzled and confused with this overwhelming event. Mary lovingly reaches out to him (and to all of us!) to console him (and us!) and ensure that this is God's holy plan of salvation.


The handmaidens in the lower right corner are washing and caring for the child Jesus to remind us of His humanity – that verily He is human. The angel above comes down from heaven to verify that Jesus is also truly divine. And of course, the giftbearing wise men, the Magi come to adore Christ and to remind us that we too must adore the Son of God and offer our most precious gift - the Gift of ourselves!

Such a brief description does not do this beautiful awe-inspiring Icon justice, but should encourage us to read, to study and experience more fully the unfathomable depth \& of all Icons, especially as we prayerfully prepare to celebrate this momentous earthshattering event – the BIRTH OF THE SON OF GOD!!!

May this be a most wonderful Christ-mas!!!







PASTORAL LETTER OF THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF CANADA ON THE OCCASION OF THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD - 2012

To the Reverend Clergy, Monastics and Religious Sisters, Seminarians and Lay-Faithful of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in Canada

Christ is Born! Glorify Him!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When as a Christian family, we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, we greet one another with words of joy: "Christ is Born! Glorify Him!". This is our expression of faith and of our commitment to give glory and honor to the One who came into this world to save us, to restore humankind's relationship with its Creator.

In the Sacred Scriptures we read of the wondrous birth of our Lord. The Gospel of Luke recounts how Mary and Joseph went from door to door in Bethlehem and were turned away. They found shelter in a humble cave, used as a stable, and there the King of Kings was born into our world. A lowly manger served as His cradle. The first to witness the event of God being born among us were simple shepherds, living and working far from the circles of power and influence. Yet, it was to them that the Angel said: "Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a babe wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." Do not be afraid; for see - I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord," (Lk. 2:10-11).

What was the response to this wonderful news that they had heard? Did they shut their minds to what was seemingly the impossible? Did they make light of it - or dismiss their vision as an illusion? No, they opened the doors of their hearts, and thus were able to accept that, which can only be discerned by those, who believe. "When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made know to us." (Lk. 2:15). These men found their way to the Infant, and through the eyes of faith were able to recognize the Saviour, the Messiah, as the Angel had told them. Without faith, they would have simply seen a new-born baby and his parents in a stable surrounded by barnyard animals, nothing new or wondrous, just another poor child born into the world!

Just as the shepherds more than two thousand years ago, so too each Christian generation is called to recognize the signs of salvation in their midst. This year here in Canada we were blessed to host the Synod of Ukrainian Catholic Bishops, held in Manitoba in September. Together on hospitable Canadian soil we sought to discern the signs of our times in order to reaffirm our faith in Jesus Christ and our commitment to give Him glory through the life and service of our Church throughout the world.

We live in a particular moment in history, a time that presents great challenges to the faith, but also great opportunities. Gathered in Synod on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the arrival to Canada of Blessed Nykyta Budka, our first Ukrainian Catholic Bishop, we reflected on both the growth of our

Church over the last century, and the need for more vibrant expressions of faith in the circumstances of the 21st century. We are reminded of this as we celebrate "The Year of Faith" proclaimed by His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI. In his pastoral letter to proclaim the year of Faith, Portafidei, "the door of faith", the Holy Father recalls the famous words of Blessed Pope John Paul II's inaugural homily: "Open wide the doors to Christ". When we celebrate our Lord's Nativity this year, we are called, dear Sisters and Brothers, in a particular way to "open wide the doors to Christ".

For us the year 2013 has another significance. It is the 1025th anniversary of the Baptism of Rus-Ukraine.
