We are especially encouraged to STOP and reevaluate our personal lives. For a period of 7 weeks we should accept a deeper discipline of prayer, fasting and almsgiving so that we can prepare ourselves for the celebration of Christ's resurrection.



I call upon all of us to take this penitential season of Lent seriously. Let us honestly ask ourselves how we have failed, how we have sinned... what we have done and what we have left undone? Let us ask ourselves if we have loved God with all our hearts and if we have loved our neighbours as ourselves. Have we forgiven those who have sinned against us? Have we forgiven ourselves for our foolish and sometimes stupid mistakes and sins?

Are we ready to confess our pride and our hypocrisy? Are we ready to admit that we have been prejudiced and that we have ignored the fact that all people have been created in God's image. Are we ready to admit to ourselves and to our God the dishonesty in our lives and how blind we often have been to human suffering and how indifferent we have been to injustice and cruelty? Are we ready to admit that we have been negligent in prayer and the worship of our Maker?

Last Sunday we celebrated Forgiveness Sunday and I invite you to continue focusing on forgiveness. Let us not try to solve all forgiveness at once, but rather stop and focus on one hurt in our lives that we have not been able to forgive. Recognize all of the feelings that come with it - anger, guilt, shame etc. and then start working at letting them all go. It will not be easy and it may take a long time to master this. But, as with everything else in life, we have to start with small steps and work toward a bigger goal. And once we have learned to forgive, we can hope to become reconciled with our neighbours and with God. We definitely will feel part of the greater community of God.

Wasn't that a wonderful Valentine's Day luncheon that our UCWL hosted last Sunday afternoon? Again, a sell-out crowd who thoroughly enjoyed themselves and also delighted in the inspiring entertainment Sich! God bless all you hard-working ladies! All your supreme efforts contributed to a very successful fund-raiser from all perspectives.

Many of you had the good fortune of feasting at our Fish Fry which takes place every Lenten Friday and is hosted by the K of C and the Men's Club. Plan to come each week and bring your friends to share in the fellowship and delicious food.

We are so very pleased that many of you proceed up the church to pray the Lenten X Way of the Cross at 6:30 and also participate in our many Lenten services. Do come as a family to pass on this tradition of prayer to your children and grandchildren.

Let us welcome Great Lent so that we can find peace and love in our hearts and share this with everyone we encounter!

Thoughts by Fr. John Sianchuk CSsR about <u>LENT</u>

Last Sunday was "Forgiveness Sunday" - the day before Great Lent. Lent is often depicted as a Carina For Others journey. Before a major journey people will often settle their affairs. Before Lent it is important that we settle the affairs of the heart, that is, that we be at peace with one another.

Often we hurt each other, even unknowingly. These hurts can fester and cause division. If we are to make this journey towards Holy Week and Easter, we must become free from anything that would separate us. We cannot celebrate the Risen Jesus, the Lord of Love, if our hearts are filled with resentment and rejection. Therefore, before we start this journey of preparation the Church offers us this Sunday as an opportunity to make amends, that is, to forgive each other. Let us not only do this within the Church, but also in our homes. It is hard to say "I'm sorry", but it is so necessary.

With Lent beginning, perhaps it would be proper to restate the fasting laws for Lent. We are asked to abstain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent. We are asked to fast, that is, to have only one meal, on the First Day of Lent, that is, tomorrow and on Good Friday. And that on these two days we also abstain from all meat and dairy products. Abstaining from meat products applies to all who are between 14 & 59 years old and fasting applies to all who are between 21 and 59.



The rest keep the spirit of the fast to the best of their ability. People who are sick, mothers, especially those who are nursing, those who in circumstances beyond their control, are all exempt from the fast and abstinence. The Church asks us to fast, first as a sign of penance for our sins and failings; and secondly, to help us temper our passions and inclinations, to gain some more self-control which becomes very important if we are to deal effectively with sin. May we all keep a good spirit of Lent.

The journey of Lent, however, is not just about giving up food, sweets, desserts, forms of entertainment, etc. The real work of Lent is an interior one. We are to look at our lives and see which areas, what attitudes, what actions, decisions, are preventing us from living fully our Christian vocation. In other words, what is preventing us from truly following Christ. We then

begin to fast from those actions. This is the fast that Christ wants - to purify our lives, to refocus upon Him, to establish new patterns, new habits in our lives which promote charity -love of our neighbor.

Sorokousty

This coming Saturday we are beginning the Service called "Sorokousty". This is a service of intercession for our deceased ancestors and for all the deceased. One of the Church's duties and a Christian's duty is to pray for the dead. God has included us in the mystery of his act of salvation. We participate through our intercession in bringing life to the deceased. It is through the prayers of the Church (which are a sign of love for them) that the deceased received the promised life from our Lord and it is through the prayers of the faithful that God's mercy flows upon them.

Our Church encourages us on **four** Saturdays of the year to gather and together pray for all the departed souls. If you have not yet done so, please inform the parish office of your list or at least, inform us of your intention that you wish us to remember each of them by name.

Pre-Sanctified Liturgy

Lent is such a precious spiritual time of the year. So often we can go through Lent and not realize that we are in the season. One of the essential elements of this time is prayer and spiritual renewal. Our parish is offering you an opportunity for this. This year we will especially concentrate on the theme of "restoring God's Image in us, and seeking areas in our life that need to be changed. (Every Lenten Wednesday at 7 pm we celebrate a special service - Pre-Sanctified Liturgy,



Again we will be celebrating the Pre-sanctified Liturgy. This is a Service that is done only during Lent in our Rite. It is a Communion Service to strengthen the faithful for their journey of Lent by the Eucharistic Christ. The Pre-sanctified Liturgy is a beautiful service with its unique music. It is a Communion Service in the context of Vespers. I really encourage you to come and experience the richness of our religious tradition.
