Slava Isusu Khrystu!

I recently read an interesting sermon by Miles Wesner and his lesson came in very handy when I was approached by a parishioner who came to me with a serious personal problem and couldn't understand why.



From the Pastor's Desk

When she complained to me about her many problems I told her that there is a place she can visit where people have no problems whatsoever and she asked me where this place is. So I told her... it's either called *Holy Family, All Saints* or *Glen Eden* cemeteries. The people there are totally free of problems! The fact that we have problems means that we are still very much alive!! Our many problems do not allow us to become too comfortable and can encourage us to grow and yes, they may allow us to experience God's presence. Sometimes it takes a *trauma* or a *personal crisis* to make us think of God.

Think about it *when everything is going smoothly, we often forget to pray...* but the moment we are faced with a real problem, we, not only pray but may even pray most fervently! Wesner gives us a wonderful example in a story about two men who had a job of charting a challenging mountain.

Each day they went up this mountain and each evening returned to their camp where they sat talking to an old shepherd. One evening the shepherd said to them that he knows the mountain like the back of his hand and that he offers go up with them. The men refused, saying that they have been up the mountain many times and besides they have a map to show them where to go if they should get lost.

But the shepherd replied: *"I know that you have a map but there is no fog on your map!"* In the morning the two men went up on the mountain and, sure enough, a dense fog enveloped them and soon they were hopelessly lost. After stumbling around for a long time, they were happily surprised by the shepherd who appeared to them and safely led them down to their camp.

Is this not our story? When things go well we are confident and self-sufficient. But when something happens and we get lost and desperate ... do we not often immediately pray for divine guidance. We look for God's presence in our lives! **We need that shepherd!**

Even though we do not welcome problems in our lives, we must admit that they can give us greater understanding. *"Nemo dat quod non habet."* We cannot give anyone what we do not have. And we may have little understanding for other people's problems if we have never known grief or suffering! Living through trials most certainly gives us more understanding which we, in turn, should share with others! When we are not battling any problems, we sometimes become indifferent or apathetic. Affliction, on the other hand, sharpens our spiritual awareness. Troubles have the potential of strengthening us.

So let us not indulge in **self-pity**. Let us not feel sorry for ourselves and become *suffering martyrs*. Let us not waste precious energy needed to fight problems. Let us look upon our various problems as an opportunity. Let us use them to experience God's presence and providence. Let us even use our problems to identify with Jesus and His suffering. Let us, therefore, become more compassionate and more caring. Let us find our way to the warm embrace of our God.

Я недавно читав цікаву проповідь *Майлс Веснера*, науку, яку я використав, коли до мене прийшла парафіянка з проблемою.

Вона мені жалілася на свої клопоти а я їй пригадав, що є місце, де люди немає жодних проблем і коли вона мене спиталася, де такого місця шукати, я відповів, що це в цвинтарях. Там люди є звільнені від всіх проблем! Факт, що ми маємо проблеми значить, що ми ще між живими! Проблеми не дозволяють нам розслабитися, вони спонукують нас рости і розвиватися і дають нам відчути Божу присутність. Часами треба *травми* або *життєвої кризи*, щоб ми подумали про Бога.

Коли все йде гладко ми **забуваємо про молитву...** але в хвилині, коли ми зустрічаємося з дійсною проблемою, ми не лишень молимося, але молимося гарячо. **Веснер** подає нам гарний приклад у розповіді про двох чоловіків, які мали завдання робити земні поміри одної гори.

Вони щодня піднімалися на цю гору і щовечора поверталися до свого табору і сідали розмовляти зі старим вівчарем. Одного вечора вівчар сказав їм, що він знає цю гору, як свою руку і що він би провів їх, куди треба. Два чоловіки добре знали дорогу і мали карту до якої можна б поглянути, якщо вони б загубилися і не хотіли, щоб вівчар з ними йшов. **Я знаю, що ви маєте карту**, сказав вівчар, **але на ній нема зазначеного туману!** Наступного ранку два чоловіки піднялися під гору і дійсно попали в густий туман та розгубилися. Вони довгий час блукали аж потрапили на чудову несподіванку... що вівчар їх знайшов.

Чи не подібна ця історія до нашого життя? Коли в житті все йде гладко, ми є самопевними і самовистачальними. Але, з хвилиною, що ми десь загубилися... ми шукаємо Божого проведіння! Ми шукаємо Божої присутності у своєму житті! **Ми потребуємо того вівчара!**

Хоч ми не любимо проблем, мусимо признати, що проблеми дають нам вирозуміння. Ми не можемо нікому давати того, чого ми не маємо, а ми не можемо мати вирозуміння до проблем інших людей, якщо ми самі ніколи не зустрічалися з якоюсь невдачею чи горем! Звичайно, що власні випробування дають нам вирозуміння, яке ми можемо використати на допомогу іншим. Якщо ми не боримося з проблемами, ми розлінивлємося. Клопоти нас посилюють.

Отже не жаліймо себе і не робім зі себе мучеників! Не тратьмо дорогоцінної енергії, щоб воювати з проблемами. Навчимося їх приймати і користаймо з цієї нагоди, щоб відчути Божу присутність і Боже проведіння. Використаймо свої проблеми, щоб зрозуміти Ісуса та Його страждання. І наслідком своїх проблем, станьмо рішучими та більш відданими. Нехай ці випробування нас провадять до Бога та Його теплих обіймів.

(Deacon) Yaroslav Buduykevych, son of Rev. Ewstahij and Maria, was born on Nov. 10, 1973, in Harasymiv, Ivano-Frankivsk region, Ukraine.

In 1995 Bishop Basil Losten of Stamford, Connecticut, USA started a seminary program in his diocese for the Ukrainian Catholic Church in Ukraine. He invited students who successfully passed their exams to the USA.

In 2000 Yaroslav graduated from St. Basil's College in Stamford, with a Bachelor of Arts, majoring in Philosophy. In the same year he entered St. Joseph's Roman Catholic Seminary, Yonkers NY. Three years later, he received a Bachelor of Sacred Theology degree, and in 2004 he graduated with a Masters of Divinity degree.

In 2003 he was ordained to the subdiaconate at St. Basil's seminary chapel by Bishop Basil Losten. After graduation Subdeacon Yaroslav went back to Ukraine where he functioned as a cantor in a local hospital chapel, and the church of Dormition of the Most Holy Mother of God. He also helped teach youth in parochial catechism programs. He is married to Olga and they have two children, Kateryna and Myroslav.

"I know that at some moment in my life God called me to the priesthood, and I gave him a positive answer. The first time I thought about priesthood was when I was a child. With those ideas rooted in my childhood I entered the seminary, and there I discerned for myself the true meaning of a vocation to the ordained ministry. With your prayers I will strive to become a good priest."
