## Dear Beloved Parishioners and Guests,

Snow and so much of it everywhere... in one particular town, the snow had drifted to several feet over the streets. A physician received an urgent call to come to a home a few blocks from his to deliver a baby, but the heavy high drifts made it impossible to get through. The frantic father-to-be then began calling his neighbours who called others, and in no time at all, men and boys appeared in the blocked streets with blowers and shovels; it took them several hours, but the doctor was able to get through just in time to deliver the baby successfully and without any complication.

During this <u>preparatory time</u> preceding the holy birth of **Our Saviour**, we are called, not to remove piles of drifted snow, but the mounds of thoughtlessness, drifts of neglect and the heaps of our offenses and sins – the things that, in effect, heavily clog the road of the **Child of Bethlehem** into our hearts...

To prepare the way, it helps us to think of what **Christmas** authentically means. We must invite the very Child of Bethlehem to come into our hearts, doing what pleases Him --- being kind to one another, reaching out to the needy, going out of our way to make someone more comfortable, more appreciated and more happy!

How much time is spent on the material preparation for Christmas – gifts, cards, decorations, food and plans for celebations! All of this in its own way is good, but there must be more! We must clear the way to our very hearts!

Even more, we must prepare His way as a parish family. The group of neighbours who cleared the drifted snow for the doctor is a fine example of such preparations – people working together.

Christmas is a *community celebration*, especially for families, both in the home and in the parish. Everyone of us is precious to *God the Father*, who in two short weeks, through the Liturgy of the Church, will again send *His only Son* to be born for the salvation of the human race.

We become ever more precious when we pray together, sing together, actively take part in the Divine Liturgy together, receive Holy Communion together!

May all of us -together — make ready His way into our hearts, as a family — into our homes, as a community — into our St. Joseph's parish, and as a people — into the worldwide family of God!

The *Light of Christ* shines most brightly at Christmas – we will receive the **Bethlehem light** today, the 15<sup>th</sup> – next Sat/Sun, please take it home and let it burn warmly in your homes during Christmas celebrations...

# MAY GOD BLESS OUR BELOVED UKRAINE!

We are very upset over the events in Ukraine and unite in spirit with the protestors who stand on Independence Square (*the Maidan*) in Kyiv. We cry with them, we worry with them and join them in most fervent prayer. The whole world is now watching Ukraine and it's good to see that the news is being reported accurately. In today's world, where just about every person in the street has access to some form of mass media, truth can no longer be hidden from people. In the 1930s millions were starved to death in Ukraine and many in the world did not even know about this.

Today we have access to live coverage and everyone can see the truth as it is happening, truth that is most painful and yet encourages one to pray most earnestly and to beg God to have mercy on the people of Ukraine.

And it most certainly is a fact that the Ukrainian people are praying! Since the demonstrators started gathering on the Maidans of Ukraine in November, new prayer initiatives are born among the people every day. Not only are all of the churches open but field chapels have been set up as well as prayer tents so that people can have a place to pray and to meet. As we follow the news we see priests of different religions and nuns stand side by side with the presenters on the stage as they lead thousands in prayer. Some people pray alone as others join groups for services of the Moleben or for praying the rosary and other forms of prayer, be it in closed places or outdoor landmarks such as the statue of the Archangel Michael in Kyiv every day at 6:00 pm. And ironically some services are offered on the backdrop of a thick column of military police. Many of the demonstrators believe that prayer is the basic weapon for the moment and the situation in Ukraine can be resolved only with God's help. His Beatitude Sviatoslav Shevchuk, the head of the Ukrainian Catholic Church has appealed to everyone: "... I ask all of you to please pray, that our Lord give His wisdom to our society in general and to each individual in particular. Let us pray that He not allow any chains of evil and that with His peace and wisdom He free our nation from all enslavement and then lay a path for us to follow into the future." The people in Ukraine are praying and let us pray with them! "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." (Matthew 18:20)

Let us pray for a miracle, so that if but once in Ukraine's history the people who are fighting for truth and justice win their fight! Let us pray for the people, who despite all odds still believe that they will overcome and let us ask God to give them strength, perseverance and persistence! And let us even pray that snow and bitter cold not fall on the heads of the cold and tired demonstrators.

We are getting ready for **Christmas**. Please remember that no matter how tasty our traditional dishes and how beautiful our gifts all of this has <u>no meaning</u> if we do not notice the **Baby Jesus** who came to this earth to save us. So let us pray to Him - let us ask Him for grace both for our loved ones and for the people in Ukraine. Let us ask for unity and peace, I wish for each and every one of you. Amen.


