Dear beloved parishioners and guests,

Have you ever seen a dog or cat chase its shadow? They run, jump and try to catch it, yet never succeed. This looks funny, yet isn't this what we sometimes do? We run and chase after something that has no substance - we chase shadows of worthless treasures... we chase shadows of shallow pleasures... we chase shadows of empty promises... We often sacrifice so much time and effort and money in these pursuits, not realizing they are often empty and meaningless...



There are also shadows that we don't necessarily chase, but that are a very strong presence in our lives – the shadows under which we live. How often we, unknowingly, live in the shadow of other people – that we are trying to be, instead of being ourselves! God never planned for us to live in anyone's shadow –He made you to be YOU with your own personal shadow – you have unique talents, abilities and gifts and you are to live your own dream! Very often we live so deeply in someone else's shadow that we do not realize that God has a specific plan for US and US ALONE! Have the courage to stand tall and to cast your own special shadow instead of hiding in someone else's...

Remember that a person's shadow is the result of their position in relation to light. Without light, there can be no shadow. If you sit in the shade, your shadow will not be seen. If you stand in the sunlight at noon, then your shadow is quite pronounced and very intense. It is our attitude toward the "light" that determines how our shadow is cast. Let us be very careful how we stand in the light!

In all of this, there is one thing that we all must understand and remember – that the true LIGHT in our lives is the Light of Christ. If we are true Christians, our mission is to follow the teachings of Christ and to be a *light* for other – and this light should be seen in our deeds and actions - in how we behave, and in "what we say"! It is far easier to broadcast to the world that we are Christians, but far more difficult to be God's light for others. Once we accept God's light and shine it for others, we will begin to cast positive shadows for others. So, let us take this spiritual responsibility very seriously, for it we cast shadows, they must be good shadows – of warmth and compassion!

Sadly, the Yanukovych corrupt government of Ukraine is casting a horrible dark shadow across the whole land and our people are suffering most greatly. Please continue to pray & support all the protestors in Kyiv who yearn to have a free democratic country.

As we remotely prepare for our Lenten season, may we strengthen the "light" that is within us and may it brightly enhance the lives of those around us...

May the good Lord bless you and me and all of us graciously...



APPEAL OF THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC HIERARCHY OF CANADA RE: THE POLITICAL CRISES IN UKRAINE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"For peace throughout the world, for the well-being of God's holy churches and for the unity of all, let us pray to the Lord."

At the start of every Divine Liturgy we pray this petition. Its significance has become increasingly important in recent days as we witness the worsening crises in our ancestral land of Ukraine. On behalf of the Ukrainian Catholic Bishops in Canada I address these words to our faithful and to all people of good will concerned with these ongoing events.

<u>Firstly</u>, we call on everyone to pray for peace and an end to violence in Ukraine. For over two months our people have been protesting peacefully in defense of their political, economic and social future. This is their democratic right and no government, political party, army or police force can deny them of this right, especially through violence.

<u>Secondly</u>, we pray for the well-being of God's holy churches. After many years of denied legal status and underground existence, our Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in Ukraine is again being threatened by the ruling authority with loss of status for standing beside and praying with her people in the streets of Kyiv. Their well-being is our concern.

<u>Thirdly</u>, we pray for the unity of all people of Ukraine. After centuries of subjugation by outside powers, in recent years the road to self-determination has been opened to Ukraine's citizens. Our prayers and support are needed to encourage them in this undertaking, something win Canada assume without question.

Dearly Beloved in Christ!

We call for prayers during all Divine Liturgies throughout our churches in Canada for the people of Ukraine in these turbulent times, including the following petition in the litany (ektenia) after the Gospel reading: We also pray for the people of Ukraine, that with the help of the Holy Spirit, they may obtain social peace, political harmony and economic stability: Lord, hear us and have mercy.

May the peace we enjoy in this country, not lessen but rather increase our concern for our brothers and sisters in our ancestral land, through the prayers of the Mother of God and all Ukrainian saints.

On behalf of the Ukrainian Catholic Bishops in Canada I send our Episcopal blessing!

MAY GOD BLESS OUR BELOVED UKRAINE!

We are very upset over the events in Ukraine and unite in spirit with the protestors who stand and suffer on Independence Square (*the Maidan*) in Kyiv. We cry with them, we worry with them and join them in most fervent prayer. The whole world is now watching Ukraine and it's good to see that the news is being reported accurately. In today's world, where just about every person in the street has access to some form of mass media, truth can no longer be hidden from people. In the 1930s millions were starved to death in Ukraine and many in the world did not even know about this. Today we have access to "live coverage" and everyone can see the truth as it is happening, truth that is most painful and yet encourages one to pray most earnestly and to beg God to have mercy on the people of Ukraine.

And it most certainly is a fact that the **Ukrainian people are praying!** Since the demonstrators started gathering on the Maidans of Ukraine in November, new prayer initiatives are born among the people every day. Not only are all of the various churches open but field chapels have been set up as well as prayer tents so that people can have a place to pray and to meet.

As we follow the news we see <u>priests of different religions and nuns</u> stand side by side with the presenters on the stage as they lead thousands in prayer. Some people pray alone as others join groups for services of the Moleben or for praying the rosary and other forms of prayer, be it in closed places or outdoor landmarks such as the statue of the Archangel Michael in Kyiv every day at 6:00 pm. And ironically some services are offered on the backdrop of a thick column of military police. Many of the demonstrators believe that **prayer** is the <u>basic weapon</u> for the moment and the situation in Ukraine can be resolved only with God's help.

Patriarch Sviatoslav Shevchuk, the head of the Ukrainian Catholic Church has appealed to everyone: "... I ask all of you to please pray, that our Lord give His wisdom to our society in general and to each individual in particular. Let us pray that He not allow any chains of evil and that with His peace and wisdom He free our nation from all enslavement and then lay a path for us to follow into the future." The people in Ukraine are praying and let us pray with them! "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." (Matthew 18:20)

Let us pray for a miracle, so that if but once in Ukraine's history the people who are fighting for truth and justice win their fight! Let us pray for the people, who despite all odds still believe that they will overcome and let us ask God to give them strength, perseverance and persistence! And let us even pray that snow and bitter cold not fall on the heads of the cold and tired demonstrators.

Let us ask the Christ Child for grace and divine blessings both for our loved ones and for all the people in Ukraine. Let us ask for unity and peace, let us pray...
