

Advent - Time of Peaceful Preparation

Unfortunately, for many of us, as the days before the Birthday of Christ get fewer, anxiety and stress grow greater. The serenity of ancient Bethlehem, lyricized in Christmas carols, is in sharp contrast to the growing pandemonium that pervades shopping malls across the country. With a month remaining, it would be good to plan a prayerful preparation for this Christmas and for those that follow.



Begin by asking what Christmas really means to you. Examine past celebrations of Christmas. What spirit has pervaded? Based on this, determine what elements are important to retain, which are superficial or unnecessarily clutter your celebration.

Christmas is first and most importantly a spiritual experience. If we honestly look at the significance of the Feast, we might have to admit that the spiritual aspect has been overwhelmed by the material considerations. If this is the case for you, then it's time to do some "Christmas housecleaning".

The <u>first step</u> is to get the *spiritual significance* into better focus. A few ideas: regular Scripture reading, time for daily prayer and reflection, journal writing or some other Spiritual Activity. Be reasonable with the time and effort you can devote, but determine to sharpen up this spiritual dimension.

Once the spiritual preparations are in focus, then plan the material approach. Make a list of the usual Christmas preparations. These might include sending cards, purchasing gifts, decorating, visiting friends and relatives, and special baking. Determine which activities you want to maintain, which could be cut out or pared down to more manageable proportions.

We often do things out of habit rather than thinking through the reason for doing them. Do you really need to send as many cards as in the past? Could you address the envelopes early and work on the cards during a specific time set aside each day?

As a way of keeping the cost of Christmas gifts more reasonable and avoiding endless trips to the store, many families exchange names and buy one person a gift.

Others donate the money they would have spent on gifts to a favorite charity. Some leave the decorating until Christmas Eve, perhaps keeping the decorations to one area of the house. Prudent limits in baking, visiting, and other activities might also be considered. The guidelines can be summed up: "all things in moderation"!

Let me make it clear that I am not trying to be a Scrooge about beautiful traditions of the season. The point is to use "common sense". Does the activity contribute to or detract from the celebration of Jesus' birth? Be honest with yourself!

Don't get discouraged if all of this doesn't work out overnight. Advent is a time of preparation. The fact that you are serious enough to want to do something is essential to good preparation and ensures a more beautiful holy Christmas!



How Many Days Till Christmas?

This will be asked many times in the coming weeks. But will this question cause us to think about preparing fro the HOLIDAY SEASON or the HOLY DAY, CHRISTMAS? In all the rushing around, it is easy to forget that Jesus is the reason for the season. This is why the Church provides us with the time of the PreChristmas FAST, PYLYPIVKA or St. Philip's Fast, sometimes called ADVENT. which begins on November 15 in our Ukrainian Catholic Church (and ends on Dec 24).

This period of preparation is a time of expectation, a time to ready our hearts for celebrating the presence of the Lord in the child born in Bethlehem.

Society tells us to prepare and expect for another reason. The parking lots at the malls will be full, and checkout lines will be busier. The world begins to prepare early and we are touched by it.

Our preparation, however, should include reflection on the rich mercy of our God who shares His only Son with us.

To prepare to celebrate the joy of Christmas.

we fast, we pray more and we increase our acts of love and compassion.

1) Read and Reflect during this Christmas fast.

Set time aside each day to spend in prayer and reading connected with Christmas and its meaning. This can include readings from the Old Testament, especially from the prophets, who foretold the coming of the Messiah.

Old Testament: Micah 5:2-4 New Testament: Matthew 1:18-25 Baruch 3:35-4:4 Matthew 2:1-12 Isaiah 7:10-16 Matthew 2:13-23 Isaiah 8:1-4, 9-10, 9:6-7 Luke 2:1-20 Genesis 1:1-13 Galatians 3:23-29 Numbers 24:2-3, 5-9,17-18 Hebrews 1:1-12 Micah 4:6-7 Hebrews 1:10-2:3 Isaiah 11:1-10, Daniel 2:31-36, 44-45 Hebrews 2:11-18

2) Things to do as a family: a) Go to church together; (b) Discuss the Sunday readings and sermon; (c) Make a special effort to look at each other in a positive way; (d) Sacrifice something you like to eat or do; (e) Reach out to someone who could use your attention and help; (f) Gather together for prayer daily; (g) Visit a shut-in together, and perhaps decorate their home for Christmas; (h) When doing Christmas baking, take some to a neighbor; (i) Perform random acts of kindness anonymously; (j) In all places, times, and situations, bring the light of Christ. Ask yourself what Jesus would do, and do it!

> Let us approach this time of preparation in the hope that this time allows us to experience a new awareness of His presence.
