Dear Parishioners and Guests!

The Christmas tree is by far the most popular form of greenery in Canada. Indeed, it has become such an integral part of our Christmas celebration that most people cannot imagine celebrating the holiday without one in their living room, workplace, or church. The beauty, the smell (provided the tree is not artificial), the fun of decorating, the spirit, the memories of holidays past all point to the reality that there is nothing like a Christmas tree.

I recall that as a teenager it was my job to get a Christmas tree for home. Once December I went searching for the most beautiful tree around. My instincts took me to the edge of town, that area where the forest still remained intact. Looking for the ideal tree is no easy task. I gazed here and there, but no tree met my satisfaction. Quite oblivious to time and direction, I wandered deeper into the forest. Then, I panicked - I was lost! Wandering back and forth and getting very cold in the process, I felt my guardian angel say, "Why don't you climb up one of the bigger trees and you should notice the smoke from the chimneys of town and know where to go." Great idea! So that's what I did, but I still had no tree. Another prompting came my way. It spurred me to an innovative solution - to cut off the top of the big tree I had climbed. I was relieved that my mission was accomplished! The tree was no viewer's delight, for the north wind had beaten one side. Yet, this Christmas tree was special! It was bruised but we decorated it with joy, for it would remind us of the tree of life, of the coming of Christ into our world.

Soon, (if not already), we will be decorating our homes for Christmas. Standing proudly along-side the nativity scene will be our elegantly arrayed "Christmas Tree." Tradition has it that this tree exalts the value of life, for during winter the evergreen becomes a sign of undying life. Christmas gifts are placed at its base. The Christmas tree also has a profound Christian significance. It calls to mind "the tree of life" (Genesis 2:9), a figure of Christ, God's supreme gift to humanity.

The message of the Christmas tree consequently is that life stays "evergreen" if we make a gift of it, not so much of material things, but of life itself: in friendship and sincere affection, in fraternal help and forgiveness, in time shared and listening to one another!

This Advent let us ponder the great gift of life that God shares with us in Jesus. "I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full." (John 10:10) May we yearn for this Life and open our hearts to it. Thank God for Christmas trees that remind us of just that!





<u>PYLYPIWKA</u> - THE PRE CHRISTMAS FAST A Journey of Expectation, Preparation and Fulfillment

THE FEAST OF THE CONCEPTION OF SAINT ANNA - DECEMBER 9

In the fullness of time <u>God sent His Son, born of a virgin in a miraculous way.</u> But long before the Nativity **God prepared the way** by making the <u>mother of God's birth miraculous as well</u>. **Anna, Mary's mother**, was barren and advanced in years, but God intervened to prepare the way for the incarnation.

Our journey to the feast of the birth of Christ is an orderly progression during the fall. We see Mary born on September 8. She enters the temple on November 21 and Christ is born on December 25. Just before the Nativity we are reminded of the special way that Mary was born to prepare us for the even more miraculous birth of Jesus.



The other pattern of time we see is the nine month cycle from conception to birth. **Jesus is God incarnate**, a perfect man. He is born exactly nine months after conception. But Mary is still human; she is born one day less than nine months later.

Mary is of the created earth, but she is the perfect vessel of creation. We link her to the temple, God's dwelling place, since she carried God in her womb. The Church sees creation gone wrong in Adam and Eve while Jesus becomes the new Adam and Mary the new Eve to show us the way to God's salvation.

THEOLOGY OF THE INCARNATION

Throughout history, the Eastern Christian Church has maintained the body of teaching and presented it consistently under the inspiration and protection of the Holy Spirit. This is our comfort and our strength. The linchpin of this teaching is the Incarnation.


Two Mysteries

The Trinity: One of the basic truths and mysteries of Christianity is that of the Holy Trinity. In as much as we can grasp this mystery, we can perceive that these **three persons of God are united** in a dynamic **communion of love**. God wants to share this relationship with his favoured creatures that daily spurn his attention and have done so since they were created.

The Incarnation: Salvation history reinforces the concept that mankind has never been left totally to its own devices. God has always been with His people. Time after time, God has intervened to save His people. Each of these interventions was prophetic of the actual entering of God into Time and History. Here we see a paradox: God is totally other yet God becomes one of us.

Even in light of this event, we can only approach an understanding of God and His ways. That which we can begin to understand is only by the grace of God's Self-revelation. God and his nature will always be a Mystery. It is only in Mystery that we see a relational God reaching out to His people by entering time and history as one of their own, our Lord, God and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

As Christians we are called to believe in this Mystery which is the Incarnation.
