# Dear Beloved in Christ.

Last Sunday we all shared in the joy and excitement of 8 precious little children who had celebrated their First Holy Reconciliation and then received Jesus in their First Holy Communion. This Communion Sunday is always a special time for the whole parish and we ask you to continue praying for them!



In light of all these wonderful Sacraments, we truly are encouraging everyone to "pray for vocations", that Jesus may bless our Ukrainian Church with more "workers" in the Lord's Harvest - to preach the "Good News", to baptize, to confirm, to marry, to bury, to be a symbol of God's presence in the community of believers...

And speaking of VOCATIONS... please let us pray constantly for young men and women (your sons and daughters, grandsons and granddaughters) to consider the invitation: "Come and follow Me!" Let us remember that it is all our responsibility to foster vocations to the priesthood and religious life, to encourage our children and young people to consider a calling from God and to have the courage to respond: "Yes!"

I humbly quote from a book I am praying: "Called to mediate the presence of Christ in the world, priests are set apart to serve the church in every way: as reconciler, as healer, as teacher, and as friend. This is a demanding and often thankless calling. It is also a calling that would be impossible without the grace they receive from the Lord especially the grace that comes from celebrating the Eucharist, the Divine Liturgy.

"We believe that when a priest follows Jesus command to "Do this in memory of Me" (Luke 22:19), he is acting in the person of Christ himself. And he is not only acting on his own behalf, as if the Eucharist were a private act of devotion between the priest and Christ. No, he is bringing with him to the altar all the people whom he serves, just as Jesus did. Just as Jesus did on the cross, even today the priest takes us, with all our sadness and pain and all of our joy and gladness, to the Father so that he can transform us by His grace and mercy. In this sense, the priest is a living icon of Christ and truly needs your prayers."

Our Ukrainian Church is facing a sad crisis - more and more parishes are closing. We simply do not have enough priests and religious brothers and sisters to strengthen and serve them.

How well do we promote vocations? Or do we possibly discourage young people from responding to this "call"? The 'media' is doing much to destroy the image of all priests, constantly dwelling on the small minority who have definitely failed in their vocation. If we are quick to criticize and speak badly of priests, certainly we are ensuring that we will have NO future priests - anyone interested would quickly become discouraged and honestly, some priests have abandoned their vocation, believing they made no difference in people's lives.

May is the month to pray for Vocations – please do pray and warmly encourage our young people to respond to this much-needed special vocation!

# 29 April 2015– UNDERSTANDING CANADA'S ASSISTED SUICIDE ISSUE Assisted Suicide, Euthanasia, Palliative Care

Dr. Larry Rados M.D. will make a presentation to inform us about the impact on our society of the Supreme Court's decision on Feb. 6, 2015 to strike down the ban on doctor assisted suicide.

If doctor assisted suicide becomes law, what will this mean for our children, grandchildren and the future of our society?

[In 2001 the Netherlands was the 1st country in the world to legalize assisted suicide. Even with safeguards in place, the number of assisted suicide deaths rose from 1,882 in 2002 to 4,829 in 2013. In the Flanders region of Belgium, 32% of all deaths by euthanasia occurred without request.

16% of those euthanized in Switzerland had no underlying medical illness.]

# Sister Josaphata Hordashevska Foundress of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate



THE SERVANT OF GOD

JOSAPHATA HORDASHEVSKA

(ON THE STEPS OF THE FIRST HOUSE,

ZUZEL, UKRAINE)

COFOUNDRESS OF THE SISTERS SERVANTS

Once there was a wonderful woman who received a Call to become the first Sister Servants of Mary Immaculate. She lived a life packed full with love and courage, and after her death, she still intercedes before God for all who come to her asking for help and healing.

Who was this woman called by God? Her name was Michaelina Hordashevska, born 1869 in Lviv, Ukraine. Her childhood was that of an average middle-class family. At age 18, after making a retreat led by a Basilian missionary, Father Jeremiah Lomnitskyj, she gradually became convinced that she would serve God as a religious.

In Ukraine as that time, there were no active communities of Ukrainian Catholic Sisters that would serve the poorer people in the villages. Father Lomnitskyj, with Father Kyrylo Siletskyj, pastor in Zhuzhel, asked her to become the first one! She consented.

Newly consecrated Sister Josaphata welcomed seven young women to a modest home in Zhuzhel on August 25, 1892. She formed the first Sisters with compassion and love, and they

entered wholeheartedly into serving all of God's people in Ukraine. Their mission was to have special concern for children, youth and those who suffered or were spiritually neglected.

To know her better, let us ponder a few of her words:

"O Christ, life of my soul, let my soul live in You, for You and through You. Let it think about You, talk about You and work for You . . . You are my wisdom, my strength and my joy."

"O Jesus, Your light continually shines brilliantly, although our eyes are dimmed by the darkness that surrounds us . . . save us through your Holy Name, let us arrive safely, and finally rest forever in Your Embrace, O my God."

"What is all the world compared to God? What is early life compared to eternity? I resolved to do my daily duties better, remembering that God is looking at me, and I want to give pleasure to His eyes."

"O Lord, my Love, my Happiness, greater than any human tenderness!"

Sr. Josaphata's life was short. She passed away at the age of 49, after great physical suffering. As well, she "was often a victim of intrigues and human envy . . . she entrusted herself to God's Providence and to the protection of the Mother of God, often in a heroic manner." And her life bore much fruit.

Following are a few of many testimonies received by the Sisters:

"In 1990, I was involved in a motor vehicle accident. The doctor's diagnosis was: a whiplash, cracked sternum and several fractured ribs. The whiplash mended and the sternum healed, but one year after the accident, the ribs had not yet healed and the doctor was concerned. A Sister Servant gave me a cross that she had placed on the urn with the mortal remains of Sister Josaphata; she told me to place this cross on the ribs and pray for healing through Sister Josaphata's intercession. I complied and prayed to Almighty God through the intercession of Sister Josaphata. Two weeks later my doctor took X-rays and lo and behold, my ribs had healed and the pain had disappeared." Kelowna, Canada.

"I am a medic and an ex-alcoholic. I had an unfortunate incident at work for which I was sentenced to ten years in prison. At that time I did not know God, but I was searching for Him. When I was released from prison, I did not know which Church I should belong to: Orthodox, Catholic, or Baptist. I went into a Catholic Church and asked the Mother of God to show me which church I should attend. I was captivated by the Catholic Church and was hungry to learn about it. I received some religious books from the Sisters Servants in Rome and among them was "Josaphata" with a prayer for her intercession. I started to pray fervently to her so that she would help me to overcome alcoholism. I saw that alone I would not be able to resist the temptation. I kept repeating: "Help me, Josaphata, I cannot do it alone, everything is drawing me to sin." I know the intercessory prayer to Josaphata from memory, and thank God I have corrected my life. Every day I feel stronger in my faith and I enjoy inner peace. Thank you, Sister Josaphata, for helping me>" — Ukraine

"A relative of mine had a serious heart attack. The doctors at the Medinstitute in Lviv and those at the Regional Hospital did not give us any hope. Then I started to pray through the intercession of Sister Josaphata. Today my relative is alive and well." – Basivka, Ukraine

This was truly a holy woman. Let us turn to Blessed Josaphata with our hopes and needs, and ask her to intercede to God for us.

Gratitude impels me to love You, and how I would rejoice if You were loved by millions and millions of hearts."
