## From the Pastor's Desk

Слава Ісусу Христу!

Glory be to Jesus Christ!

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, while in church, many of us may be getting a whiff of a wonderful fragrance. It is not the sweet smell of incense, but the aroma of our parish's Fall Supper which will be served this afternoon. A sincere "thank you" is extended to all the members of the Women's League and their helpers who have and are working so faithfully to make this event a success. Also, the Knights of Columbus deserve a word of grateful thanks. On Thursday afternoon, a number of Knights did a wonderful job sprucing up our church property. What looked like a ton leaves were gathered and bagged. The Knights' hard work certainly made our church grounds shine.

On November 1, 1944, a great church leader entered eternal life. Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky was the leader of our Ukrainian Catholic Church from 1900-1944. His leadership was felt in the church and in society. He visited Canada twice. He saved the lives of many people during the Second World War. One newspaper article stated that Sheptytsky *"was first met with distrust but later gained respect even from his enemies."* This past July, Pope Francis declared Metropolitan Andrey "Venerable". This is a major step forward in the process of his canonization. He is certainly a hero of our faith who can intercede for us and inspire us.

Often, at this time or year, I am asked about the Feast of All Saints. I usually respond by saying: It is very important to remember all the saints, known or unknown, whether officially declared a "saint" by the Church or not. Saints have been *"Sent"* (which could be abbreviated in the following way: "St.") by God to proclaim the Gospel by their lives. Their stories can certainly inspire us. They are our heavenly friends who we can call upon to intercede for us. Our parish is privileged to have within our church Blessed Vasyl, whose life can inspire us and whose intercession can help us. On our liturgical calendar, the Feast of All Saints is celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost. Other churches celebrate this feast today, November 1.

In a short time, we will encounter many well crafted images and messages about the "Holiday Season". In order not to be overwhelm with the upcoming hustle and bustle, it is extremely important to pause and prepare for Christ's Nativity. To help us the church gives us a time of preparation starting on November 15. This pre-Christmas fast is referred to as "Pylypivka" (Пилипівка) or "Phillip's Fast", because it begins the day after the Feast of St Phillip (November 14). In the Gospel for that day, Philip invites Nathaniel to "Come and see" Jesus. During Pylypivka, we too are invited to see and encounter Jesus in a new way. The following question could be pondered as we approach the Nativity: *Is Christmas a holiday or a holyday?* I am sure that by reflecting on this question, we will likely begin to see Jesus in a new way.

## "Make Her Known Throughout the World"



With these words, Pope Pius IX entrusted the **Icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help** to the Redemptorists. In 1866, the Icon was placed in the church of St. Alphonsus in Rome for veneration by the faithful and from there devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help spread throughout the world. The year 2016 is the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this moment. A Jubilee Year to honour the Icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help and to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary began on June 27, 2015 and continue until June 27, 2016. Knowing that the Icon contains the great message of God's Redemptive Love, Redemptorists throughout the world have chosen as a theme for the Jubilee Year:

### **Mother of Perpetual Help, Icon of Love.**

*O Mother of Perpetual Help,  
We come before your holy Icon seeking to follow  
Your Son. Mary, please gently guide us to enter  
more deeply into the mystery of Redemption.*

*Help us as we contemplate the Incarnation,  
Passion, Death and Resurrection of Your Son,  
Jesus, Our Redeemer. Help us to receive and  
accept the Light of Christ that is in your arms.  
Mary, we present our needs to you and ask that  
you place them in the hands of your Son.*

*Most Holy Mother of God,  
Our Mother of Perpetual Help, save us. Amen.*

## ***Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky***

***1865 - 1944***

The Great Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky was the most influential Ukrainian Catholic leader of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. He led the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in the tumultuous period of both world wars and at the beginning of the Soviet occupation. His pastoral writings, accomplishments, and inspiration as Bishop of Stanislaviv (1899-1901) and Metropolitan of Halych, Ukraine (1901-1944), literally fill volumes.

As Metropolitan of Halych, he did whatever he could for the spiritual, cultural, and humanitarian needs of his people. Born into an aristocratic family, Metropolitan Andrey used his resources to create a free clinic, provide scholarships, and aid victims of famine, flooding and war. He provided his flock with churches, schools, orphanages, institutions of advanced studies, museums, hospitals, homes for the aged and needy, schools of painting, and libraries.

Metropolitan Andrey regarded the seminary to be very important in providing him with learned, hardworking, and pious priests. To this end, he strived to grant the best spiritual and theological formation for his seminarians. He staffed his seminaries with the best priests and sent his most promising students to major theological centers, such as Rome, Innsbruck, and Vienna.

The Great Metropolitan visited Ukrainian Catholic communities in the United States and Canada in 1910 and in 1921, and Brazil and Argentina in 1922.

By most accounts, Sheptytsky was a man ahead of his time. He studied Hebrew to better relate to Ukraine's Jewish community, and when he visited villages, he typically was greeted both by the priest and the local rabbi. During World War II, he courageously sheltered 150 Jews in his residence and his monasteries, and he also produced a pastoral letter denouncing Nazi atrocities.

As leader of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, he reached out to the Orthodox when ecumenism was not yet an official church policy. Because of this interest in the unity of the eastern churches and his untiring efforts towards this noble project, he is often spoken of as an Apostle of Unity.

As Moses stands out in the history of the Israelite nation, so the figure of Metropolitan Andrew rises above all other Ukrainian Catholic Church giants. Metropolitan Andrey represents the finest achievements of Ukrainian Christianity. His spiritual life was characterized by simplicity, compassion, and discipline. In a sense, he personifies the Gospel values of his people.

On July 16 of this year Pope Francis signed the decree recognizing the heroic virtues of Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky. The recognition is an initial step in the sainthood process; the decree entitles Sheptytsky to be referred to as "Venerable," and opens the door to his eventual beatification and canonization as a saint.
