"This gentleman gave confession a second chance"

A bad experience of the confession put a certain gentleman off confession for years. One Saturday evening just before Liturgy he asked the priest to hear his confession. The priest agreed to do so. But he felt that the priest didn't really listen to him; he felt the priest was simply going through the motions, anxious to get it over with as quickly as possible, and so this man left the confessional feeling worse than when he went in.

He felt so annoyed about it, he says, that he went for a long time without the sacrament of reconciliation. Years later, the twisting road of his life led him back to the church and the sacraments. There were many reasons for his return, he says: the deaths of his parents, his wife's prayers, and a growing sense that there had to be more to life than just getting up and going to work and planning where to go out for dinner or where to spend the next holiday. Before long he became a daily communicant.

Then one day he decided to give confession another chance and he visited a church popular with confession-goers. After entering the confessional, he found himself seated opposite a kindly old priest. He cleared his throat and began: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been 10 years since my last confession."

The priest broke into a small smile. "Welcome back," he said. "It's good to see you again." They had never seen each other before in their lives but this man knew what he meant.

And with that, he began his confession. The priest listened, and nodded. When it was over he gave the man a mild penance and some gentle advice: "Just live the Gospel," he said softly. "Just live the Gospel." He sighed and smiled. "There you are. Good as new. God bless you."

It was, according to this man, the first time in a long time that those words stuck. And he says that when he left that confessional he did feel, in fact, "good as new." So he returned a few weeks later, and a few weeks after that—again and again and again. It became a habit, a practice that has had a transforming effect on his life. Some time later he was ordained a Deacon.

This gentleman gave confession a second chance and he was delighted he did. He experienced the power and the beauty of the sacrament when it is celebrated as it should.

In confession, the focus is not on our sins but on God's bountiful forgiveness, not on our failings but on God's mercy, not on raking over the past but on being restored, set free, made whole again. Good as new.

The profound act of being reconciled with God enables us to live resurrected lives every time we emerge from the confessional. We are given grace. We are good as new.

That is the promise and the invitation the sacrament of reconciliation offers each one of us. It is a promise and an experience of God's bountiful love. It's an invitation we should respond to during this Season of Great Lent and as often as we can.

The Divine Liturgy of St Basil the Great

On Sundays in the Great Fast we honor saints who have a special meaning for us as we fast. Every Sunday we remember one in a special way: by praying the Liturgy called by his name: the Liturgy of St Basil the Great.

Born in Cappadocia (modern Turkey) in 330, St Basil came from a wealthy family and received the best education of his day. He could have become a revered scholar and professor, but chose to live the monastic life instead. At the age of 34 St Basil was ordained a priest and six years later he was chosen to be Archbishop of Caesarea. For the next nine years St Basil devoted himself to writing instructions for his people, to arranging the Liturgy, and to establishing orphanages, hospitals and homes for the elderly. He died on January 1, 379 and is revered as one of the Three Holy Hierarchs of the fourth century.

The Divine Liturgy of St Basil is celebrated ten times each year, including every Sunday during the Great Fast. The people's parts are mostly the same as our ordinary Liturgy of St John Chrysostom. The priest's parts are quite different, giving us a thorough instruction in the mystery of salvation. In this prayer St Basil tells us what we should ask for in Holy Communion:

"Unite all of us, who share in this one bread and cup, with one another for communion in the one Holy Spirit, and to let none of us share in the holy body and blood of your Christ to judgment or condemnation; but that we may find mercy and grace with all the saints, who have been well-pleasing to you since time began."
