Long ago...so long ago that some of us were almost still young....the Ukrainian Knights had a special project....

It was the idea of our Metropolitan and Archbishop Michael: a pro-life memorial to be constructed on the grounds of the Consistory --- a bronze statue by his friend Leo Mol---showing children playing by a pond.

To raise money, the Knights sold stickers that said "*Будемо!*" (which says *Welcome!* in Ukrainian) which were to be placed on the license plate of one's car. Many stickers were sold, resulting in net proceeds of approximately \$1,700.00. Not enough for the project, but a good start...but the Archbishop and the artist are no longer with us, and the project is not going ahead as originally envisioned.

So now what? The focus now is on putting the money toward some as yet undecided project which will be pro-life and which will in some way be something of a launching pad for ongoing further pro-life work.

Brothers,

I am referring you to an article written by Peter Wolfgang, Executive Director of the Family Institute of Connecticut (ctfamily.org). He points out that:

"The campaign to legalize physician-assisted death is well-funded and politically connected. It plays on the fears many people have of spending their final years in pain, hooked up to a machine. As defenders of the faith, we must be prepared to turn back this attack on the elderly and disabled by learning what assisted suicide is and what true death with dignity entails."

He states that: "Most people who opt for assisted suicide...do not do so because they are in pain, and very few are referred to a psychologist to be treated for possible depression. In our own states, we must support true end-of-life care that includes adequate pain management as well as spiritual and personal accompaniment of ill and elderly persons that is best expressed in love."

He tells us that: "The organization which I run, the Family Institute of Connecticut, is part of a coalition that turned away efforts to legalize assisted suicide in our State for the past four years."

No Pain, No Gain

"But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified."¹

I live at the top of a mile-long very steep hill and for exercise I like to ride my mountain bike down and up our hill at least three times a week. It's great fun riding down but riding up is another story ... and it never seems to get easier. "Do you enjoy riding?" someone asks. My answer? "I love having ridden."

True, I don't enjoy riding up our hill. It's hard work, but I love having ridden because of the benefits gained. There is an immediate benefit in that it's a great stress reliever, offsetting some of the adverse affects of stress. It also produces endorphins in the brain that helps me feel much better emotionally than when I don't exercise regularly. Plus it helps keep my body in shape; is great for the circulatory system, and helps to keep fit physically. Furthermore, as Paul suggests, discipline of the body helps to maintain discipline in other areas of life.

Self-discipline in every area of life is a never-ending challenge but the dividends of living a disciplined life are well worth every effort put forth. Discipline never happens by chance. It is a choice—a fresh choice every day!
