

Dear Parishioners,

The month of November is filled with opportunities "to remember". Allow me to mention a few.

Of course, there is "Remembrance Day", honouring all those who fought for freedom. There is a song called "*A Pittance of Time*", written by Terry Kelly in 2002. It focuses on the importance of the two minutes of silence that is observed on November 11<sup>th</sup>. I invite you to search for this song on Youtube. The message is very clear and powerful.

November 1<sup>st</sup> is another day with an opportunity *to remember*. On that day, a great church leader entered eternal life, Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky was the leader of our Ukrainian Catholic Church from 1900-1944. His leadership was felt in the church and in society. He visited Canada twice. He saved the lives of many people during the Second World War. One newspaper article stated that Sheptytsky "*was first met with distrust but later gained respect even from his enemies.*" In 2015, Pope Francis declared Metropolitan Andrey "Venerable". This is a major step forward in the process of his canonization. He is certainly a hero of our faith who can intercede for us and inspire us.

Often, at this time of year, I am asked about the Feast of All Saints. I usually respond by saying: It is very important to remember all the saints, known or unknown, whether officially declared a "saint" by the Church or not. Saints have been "*Sent*" (which could be abbreviated in the following way: "*St.*") by God to proclaim the Gospel by their lives, Their stories can certainly inspire us. They are our heavenly friends who we can call upon to intercede for us. Our parish is privileged to have within our church Blessed Vasyl, whose life can inspire us and whose intercession can help us. On our liturgical calendar, the Feast of All Saints is celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost. Other churches celebrate this feast today, November 1.

Towards the end of November, Ukrainians throughout the world remember the *Holodomor Famine- Genocide of 1932-1933*. Millions of people died through starvation caused by this man made event. By remembering this tragic event it will help prevent other acts of injustice from happening.

Also in November, we are called to remember the importance of preparing for the great feast of the Nativity of our Lord on December 25<sup>th</sup>. This time of prayer, fasting and doing good works begins on November 15<sup>th</sup>, 40 days before Christmas and is called *Pylpivka*.

Hopefully, we may now be more aware of the *opportunities of remembering* that is part of the month of November. Above all as followers of Our Lord, is it extremely important to remember to be Christ-like. May our actions and words be influenced by God's love for us. And when others see our Christ-like examples, they may be inspired to remember.

## 22nd Sunday after Pentecost - November 1, 2020

**Tropar, tone 5:** Let us the faithful acclaim and worship the word,\* co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit,\* and born of the Virgin for our salvation.\* For He willed to be lifted up on the cross in the flesh,\* to suffer death and to raise the dead\* by His glorious resurrection.

**Kondak, tone 5:** You, my Savior, descended to Hades,\* and as the Almighty, You shattered its gates.\* With Yourself You, as the Creator, raised the dead and shattered the sting of death,\* and delivered Adam from the curse, O Lover of Mankind.\* And so we cry out: "Save us, O Lord."

**Prokimen, tone 5:** You, O Lord, will guard us and will keep us from this generation, and for ever.

**Verse:** *Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer left a just man.*

**Epistle:** A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Galatians, (Gal.6:11-18)

Brothers and Sisters! See, I write to you in my own large handwriting! Those who are trying to force you to be circumcised are making a play for human approval — with an eye to escaping persecution for the cross of Christ. The very ones who accept circumcision do not follow the law themselves. They want you to be circumcised only that they may boast about your bodily observance. May I never boast of anything but the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ! Through it, the world has been crucified to me and I to the world. It means nothing whether one is circumcised or not. All that matters is that one is created anew. Peace and mercy on all who follow this rule of life, and on the Israel of God. Henceforth, let no man trouble me, for I bear the brand marks of Jesus in my body. Brothers, may the favour of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen.

*For You have said: Mercy shall be built up for ever; in the heavens Your truth shall be prepared.*

**Gospel: Luke 16:19-31**

The Lord told this parable: "Once there was a rich man who dressed in purple and linen and feasted splendidly every day. At his gate lay a beggar named Lazarus who was covered with sores. Lazarus longed to eat the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. The dogs even came and licked his sores. Eventually the beggar died. He was carried by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man likewise died and was buried. From the abode of the dead where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham afar off, and Lazarus resting in his bosom. He called out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water to refresh my tongue, for I am tortured in these flames.' 'My child,' replied Abraham, 'remember that you were well off in your lifetime, while Lazarus was in misery. Now he has found consolation here, but you have found torment. And that is not all. Between you and us there is fixed a great abyss, so that those who might wish to cross from here to you cannot do so, nor can anyone cross from your side to us.' 'Father, I ask you, then,' the rich man said, 'send him to my father's house where I have five brothers. Let him

be a warning to them so that they may not end in this place of torment.' Abraham answered, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them hear them.' 'No, Father Abraham,' replied the rich man, 'But if someone would only go to them from the dead, then they would repent.' Abraham said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, they will not be convinced even if one should rise from the dead.'"

The praise of Saint Michael stems from the fact that in defense of God's glory he led all the good angels against the rebellion of Satan (Revelations 12:7-9). He is depicted both as a military leader clad in full armor and as a minister wearing the deacon's sticharion.
