

Dear Parishioners,

A common experience that all of us have had is hearing a song from our past, which triggers memories. They could be of times with family and friends, experiences from our school years, special trips, and significant turning points in our lives.

Even though our faith experiences are not “songs” that we hear over the radio, they can also trigger thoughts of special blessings when we remember them, which may just help us in the present moment. One such blessing is the gift of “hope”.

When I was a seminarian, all of my theology courses were very good. One that stands out was the “confession practicum”. In this course, one learned how to not only hear confessions, but how this healing sacrament of reconciliation was to be administered, guided by the grace of God. One pearl of wisdom that the professor shared with all of us was the following: *Remember no matter how heavy the hearts of those coming for confession may be, remember that a message of hope must be communicated. If hope cannot be conveyed, then what does that say about our God.*

God always provides us with hope, even during moments of darkness. It is extremely important to remember this, especially during the current time of pandemic. Without hope, it is so easy to fall into, what one author calls the *cycle of despair*, which contains such feelings of fear, anxiety, revenge, hostility, and hatred. With belief and trust in God, we enter in what can be called the *cycle of hope*. This experience allows the love of God to be felt in a new way which turns our sufferings into endurance, that strengthens our character, and causes us to be more open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, especially through the darkest moments in our lives.

As all of us continue to travel through this time of pandemic, let it be with a sense of hope, and may the following words of St. Paul be a source of God’s grace and comfort:

“Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access [by faith] to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance, proven character, and proven character, hope, and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit that has been given to us. Romans 5:1-5

St. Michael, the Archangel

Tropar, tone 6: Angelic powers were upon Your tomb* and the guards became like dead men;* Mary stood before Your tomb seeking Your most pure body.* You captured Hades without being overcome by it.* You met the Virgin and granted life.* O Lord, risen from the dead, glory be to You.

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Ephesians. (Eph. 2:4-10)

Brothers and Sisters! God is rich in mercy; because of his great love for us he brought us to life with Christ when we were dead in sin. By this favor you were saved. Both with and in Christ Jesus he raised us up and gave us a place in the heavens, that in ages to come he might display his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. I repeat, it is owing to his favor that salvation is yours through faith. This is not your own doing, it is God's gift; neither is it a reward for anything you have accomplished, so let no one pride himself on it. We are truly his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to lead the life of good deeds which God prepared for us in advance.

Alleluia Verses: *He who lives in the aid of the Most High, shall dwell under the protection of the God of heaven.*

He says to the Lord: You are my protector and my refuge, my God, in Whom I hope.

Gospel: Luke 8:26-39

At that time, Jesus came into the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. When he came to land, he was met by a man from the town who was possessed by demons. For a long time he had not worn any clothes, he did not live in a house, but among the tombstones. On seeing Jesus he began to shriek; then he fell at his feet and exclaimed at the top of his voice, "Jesus, Son of God Most High, why do you meddle with me? Do not torment me, I beg you." By now Jesus was ordering the unclean spirit to come out of the man, This spirit had taken hold of him many a time. The man used to be tied with chains and fetters, but he would break his bonds and the demon would drive him into places of solitude. "What is your name?" Jesus demanded. "Legion," he answered, because the demons who had entered him were many. They pleaded with him not to order them back to the abyss. It happened that a large herd of swine was feeding nearby on the hillside, and the demons asked him to permit them to enter the swine. This he granted. The demons then came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd charged down the bluff into the lake, where they drowned. When the swineherds saw what had happened, they took to their heels and brought the news to the town

and country roundabout. The people went out to see for themselves what had happened. Coming on Jesus, they found the man from whom the devils had departed sitting at his feet dressed and in his full senses; this sight terrified them. They were told by witnesses how the possessed man had been cured. Shortly afterward, the entire population of the Gerasene territory asked Jesus to leave their neighborhood, for a great fear had seized them; so he got into the boat and went back across the lake. The man from whom the devils had departed asked to come with him, but he sent him away with the words, "Go back home and recount all that God has done for you." The man went all through the town making public what Jesus had done for him.

Feast of St. John Chrysostom - November 13

Our father among the saints, John Chrysostom (347-407), Archbishop of Constantinople, was a notable bishop and preacher from the fourth and fifth centuries in Syria and Constantinople. He was born in Antioch of noble parents: his father was a high-ranking military officer. He is famous for eloquence in public speaking, his denunciation of abuse of authority in the Church and in the Roman Empire of the time, and for a Divine Liturgy attributed to him. He had notable ascetic sensibilities. After his death he was named Chrysostom, which comes from the Greek, "golden-mouthed." The Church honours him as a saint (feast day, November 13) and counts him among the Three Holy Hierarchs (feast day, January 30), together with Saints Basil the Great and Gregory the Theologian.
