Dear Parishioners,

Often when a year is ending and a new one is about to begin, we are encouraged that we “ring out the old” and “ring in the new”. What are the origins of these phrases.

It used to be customary in England to “ring out” the Old Year at midnight on New Year's Eve by ringing church bells as if there was a funeral. Then when the clock hits midnight, the tone of the bells would change into a joyful ring to welcome in the new year. There is a poem, written in the 1850's by Lord Alfred Tennyson, that refers to this custom. Below are a few lines from this poem entitled *Ring Out, Wild Bells*.

*Ring out the old, ring in the new, Ring, happy bells, across the snow;
The year is going, let him go; Ring out the false, ring in the true
Ring in the love of truth and right, Ring in the common love of good.
Ring out old shapes of foul disease; Ring out the narrowing lust of gold;
Ring out the thousand wars of old, Ring in the thousand years of peace.
Ring in the valiant man and free, The larger heart, the kindlier hand;
Ring out the darkness of the land, Ring in the Christ that is to be.*

Just a few days ago, we celebrated a very important feast day, the Theophany of Our Lord, the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. Could this holy day be described as “ringing in the new”? After all, Jesus is now revealed to the whole world as the Saviour, the Messiah. It seems to be the start of something new. On the surface, this seems so, but after reflecting on this great mystery, it is easy to see that there is something more.

Jesus came not just to “ring in” something new. He came to restore God's original plan, that was derailed by the sin of Adam. The mission of the Saviour was to reverse the ancient curse. In other words, to “ring out” corruption, sin and death, and to “ring in” God's original plan, his original blessing.

The feast of Theophany invites each and everyone of us to partake in the “ringing out” of corruption and the “ringing in” of God's blessings, through renewal, restoration, and reconciliation. These themes are certainly reflected in the prayers that were prayed during the solemn blessing of water that took place on this feast day. By being open to receive the graces of renewal, restoration, and reconciliation, we will help God “ring in” His original plan.

Sunday Tropar, tone 7: By Your cross You destroyed death;* You opened Paradise to the thief;* You changed the lamentation of the myrrh-bearers to joy,* and charged the apostles to proclaim* that You are risen, O Christ, our God,* offering great mercy to the world.

Festive Tropar, tone 1: At your baptism in the Jordan, O Lord,* worship of the Trinity was revealed;* for the Father's voice bore witness to You, calling You his beloved Son,* and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the truth of these words.* O Christ God, who appeared and enlightened the world,* glory be to You!

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever. Amen!

Festive Kondak, tone 4: Today You have revealed Yourself to the universe,* and Your light O Lord has shone upon us* who spiritually sing to You:* You have come and revealed yourself, O inaccessible light.

Prokimen, tone 1: Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us,* as we have hoped in You.

Verse: *Rejoice in the Lord, O you just;* praise befits the righteous.*

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Ephesians, (Eph. 4:7-13)

Brothers and Sisters! Each of us has received God's favor in the measure in which Christ bestows it. Thus you find Scripture saying; "When he ascended on high, he took a host of captives and gave gifts to men." "He ascended," what does this mean but that he had first descended into the lower regions of the earth? He who descended is the very one who ascended high above the heavens, that he might fill all men with his gifts. It is he who gave apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers in roles of service for the faithful to build up the body of Christ, till we become one in faith and in the knowledge of God's Son, and form that perfect man who is Christ come to full stature.

Alleluia Verses: *God gives me vindication,* and has subdued peoples under me.*

Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, David, and to His posterity for ever.*

Gospel: Matthew 4:12-17

At that time when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went down to live in Capernaum by the sea near the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, to fulfill what had been said through Isaiah the prophet: "Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali along the sea beyond the Jordan, heathen Galilee: A people living in darkness has seen a great light. On those who inhabit a land overshadowed by death, light has arisen." From that time on Jesus began to proclaim this theme: "Reform your lives! The kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Instead of 'It is truly right . . .': O my soul, glorify Christ the King* baptized in the River Jordan.* No tongue has the power* to fittingly extol you;* and even a supernatural mind* is powerless to glorify you, O Mother of God.* But in your graciousness, accept our faith* because you know our holy ambition;* for you are the protectress of Christians,* and we extol you.

Communion Hymn: The grace of God has appeared,* offering salvation to all men.

Praise the Lord from the heavens,* praise Him in the highest.* Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
