

Dear Parishioners,

A few years ago, I was celebrating our Divine Liturgy on October 31st at one of the local nursing homes. As usual, at the end of the service, I would take Holy Communion to the residents who were unable to attend. As I walked through the corridors, still dressed in my vestments, I heard several employees comment, “Hey, nice costume.”

Today happens to be Halloween. It is a day that children go from door to door for candy, dressed in costumes and masks in order to hide their identities. Priestly vestments are not meant to hide, but to help reveal a greater reality. Just as the uniforms of first responders may be clothes, they are also visible reminders that these individuals are here to help.

At our Christenings, all of us were dressed in our baptismal gowns and a *kryzhma* was draped over us. These were not just clothes for the occasion, but they are visible signs pointing to the “new life in Christ” that was just received through the sacrament. This spiritual reality is affirmed when the following response is sung: “*All of you who have been baptized in Christ has put on Christ, Alleluia.* (Galatians 3:27).”

At the end of this day, all Halloween costumes will be taken off and put away until next year. The spiritual reality of the new life received at our baptisms is ever present. It can never be taken off. True, we may forget about it. True, we may try on different “attire” (attitudes) that may influence our behaviour in ways that are not pleasing to God. Yet, despite of this, let us remember, that God is closer than we think and He is always willing to help us to not disguise or hide, but to let our “new life in Christ” to shine.

Feast of Christ the King Sunday, October 31, 2021

Tropar, tone 4: Christ, Our God, Your kingship has taken us out of the power of darkness* and brought us into the Kingdom of Your love.* You who are eternal, appeared as a King.* Lord, glory be to You.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever. Amen!

Kondak, tone 7: Let us adore and fall down before the immortal King of ages,* the only all-wise God Christ, saying:* “Power, honor and kingdom have been bestowed upon You,* and for this reason all the nations will serve You.* Your power is everlasting* and Your kingdom will not crumble,* because the eternal King Christ* became King for our sake.

Prokimen, tone 3: Sing to our God, sing; sing to our King, sing.

Verse: *God is king of the whole world: play your best in his honor!*

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Colossians. (Col. 1:12-20)

Brothers and Sisters! Give thanks to the Father for having made you worthy to share the lot of the saints in light. He rescued us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of his beloved Son. Through him we have redemption, the forgiveness of our sins, He is the image of the invisible God, the first-born of all creatures. In him everything in heaven and on earth was created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominations, principalities or powers; all were created through him, and for him. He is before all else that is. In him everything continues in being. It is he who is head of the body, the church; he who is the beginning, the first-born of the dead, so that primacy may be his I everything. It pleased God to make absolute fullness reside in him and by means of him, to reconcile everything in his person both on earth and in the heavens, making peace through the blood of his cross.

Alleluia Verses: *His empire hall stretch from sea to sea, from the river to the ends of the earth.*

All kings will do Him homage, all nations become his servants.

Gospel: John 18:33-37

At that time, Pilate went back into the praetorium and summoned Jesus. “Are you the King of the Jews?” he asked him. Jesus answered, “Are you saying this on your own, or have others been telling you about me?” “I am no Jew!” Pilate retorted. “It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me. What have you done?” Jesus answered: “My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my subjects would be fighting to save me from being handed over to the Jews. As it is, my kingdom is not here.” At this Pilate said to him, “So, then, you are a king?” Jesus replied: “It is you who say I am a king. The reason I was born, the reason why I came into the world is to testify to the truth. Anyone committed to the truth hears my voice.”

Instead of ‘It is truly right ‘: My soul, glorify Christ* who became the King of the universe.* Lord God, the Son of the eternal Father,* became Man by the Virgin and appeared among us* to enlighten those who dwelt in darkness,* and to assemble those who were scattered.* For this reason we glorify* the ever-praised Mother of God.

The Prayer for Divine Wisdom

The following prayer was written by Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky.

O Great and Almighty God, send down upon me from Your high and holy heavens and from the throne of Your holy glory, Your holy wisdom, that sits at Your side. Grant me the wisdom of Your good pleasure so that in my life I may know how to desire fervently, seek wisely, acknowledge in truth and fulfil perfectly that which is pleasing to You, to the glory and honour of You holy Name, "to the praise of the glory of Your grace." Grant me, O God, the wisdom of my state, so that I may do what You desire; grant that I may understand my obligations, grant me the wisdom of my duties, and grant that I may do them as they ought to be done and as is fitting to Your glory and for the benefit of my soul. Grant me the wisdom of Your ways and the wisdom to walk the paths of Your holy will. Grant me the wisdom of success and failure so that I would know how not to exalt myself in the former and not to be downcast in the latter. Grant me the wisdom of joy and the wisdom of sadness; may I rejoice only in that which leads to You and be sad only in that which separates from You. Grant me the wisdom of everything that passes and everything that lasts; may the first decrease in my sight, and the second grow. Grant me the wisdom of work and the wisdom of rest; may work for You be luxury for me, and rest without You – fatigue. Grant me the wisdom of a sincere and straight-forward intention, the wisdom of simplicity, the wisdom of sincerity. May my heart turn to You and seek You in all things all my life long. Grant me the wisdom of obedience for Your law, for Your Church. Grant me the wisdom of poverty, so that I would never value goods in any other way except according to their real worth. Grant me the wisdom of chastity according to my state and vocation.

Grant me the wisdom of patience, the wisdom of humility, the wisdom of gladness and seriousness, the wisdom of the fear of the Lord; the wisdom of truthfulness and of good deeds; may I be patient with no complaining, humble without the least pretending, joyful without inordinate laughter, serious without severity; that I may fear You without the temptation to despair; that I may be truthful without the shadow of duplicity; may all my good deeds be free from self-complacency. Grant me the wisdom to admonish my neighbour when necessary without exalting myself; grant that I may edify in word and deed without hypocrisy. Grant me, O Lord, the wisdom of vigilance, attention and wariness; may no vain thought lead me astray. Grant me the wisdom of nobleness; may I never be brought down by any impure and unworthy attachment. Grant me the wisdom of what is right; may no selfish intention ever lead me away from the path of my duties. Grant me the wisdom of courage and strength; may no storm overthrow me. Grant me the wisdom of freedom; may no powerful passion ever enslave me. Grant me the wisdom of the theological virtues and the moral virtues: faith, hope, love, prudence, devotion, temperance and fortitude.

Grant me, O Lord, the wisdom of the apostles, the wisdom of the martyrs; grant me a priestly and pastoral wisdom; grant me the wisdom of preachers and teachers; grant me the wisdom of those who administer the Holy Mysteries; grant me the Eucharistic wisdom and mystical wisdom – the wisdom of prayer and spiritual wisdom, and above all, O Lord, grant me the wisdom of sincere repentance, imperfect and perfect contrition; grant me the wisdom of to know myself in my weakness and malice; grant me the wisdom of mortification and fasting; grant me the wisdom of self-denial and self-sacrifice; grant me the wisdom of sacrifice, the wisdom of the Cross, the wisdom of Blood.

O God, grant me, finally, that wisdom which, in accord with Your holy purpose, leads to the unity of churches under one supreme pastor, the Universal Pontiff; grant me the wisdom to cherish the work of holy unity, to love it and to consecrate my life to it. Grant me the wisdom of our Eastern rite, to hold it, to renew it and develop it. Grant me the wisdom of the Fathers of the holy Eastern Church and all the great ecclesiastical teachers. Grant me the wisdom of Your great apostle, Paul, so that I would at least well understand his epistles, remember them and know how to explain them to Your people.. Grant me the wisdom of Your first Vicar that I may understand the designs of Your Divine Providence, which governs the Church through the Roman Pontiffs; grant me the wisdom of obedience to them and to the Universal Catholic Church; grant me the wisdom of church history and theology; grant me the wisdom that I and my people lack; grant me the wisdom of true satisfaction, true happiness. Amen.

Feast of Christ the King



Understanding today's feast of Christ the King may be particularly challenging. While most of us do not have direct experience with kings or royalty, we have a sense of who they are. We know that royalty have sovereignty over their kingdoms. We know that those who are subjects to royalty offer them allegiance and honor. To understand how Christ is our king, we extend and magnify what we know to be true of the best of human royalty. Christ's kingship extends to all places, all people, and all times. Christ manifests his kingship through his death on the cross in which he offered salvation to everyone. Those who can see with eyes of faith recognize Jesus to be our heavenly king. Jesus came into the world, but the world did not know him. In John's language, the world prefers the darkness, and yet the light will not be overcome by the darkness. Truth has been another important theme in John's Gospel. We see it emphasized in the conclusion of the dialogue between Jesus and Pilate. Those who know the truth will recognize Jesus as king and will know how to interpret this insight. Yet Jesus' kingship was hidden from many of his contemporaries. Only those chosen, those who have the eyes of faith, are able to see. As modern disciples of Jesus, we also struggle at times to recognize Jesus as king. Today's Gospel invites us to see with eyes of faith that we might recognize that Jesus, through his crucifixion and death, is indeed king and Savior of all.
