

Dear Parishioners:

This past week our city of Winnipeg was honoured to welcome the Mayor of Lviv His Hon. Andriy Sadovyy to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the twinning of these two cities. I had the privledge of meeting the mayor several times in Ukraine. He is a parishioner of one of our Redemptorist parishes in Lviv and a friend of our Fathers. He is also very aware of Sister Natalia and her work with abandoned teenage girls who are at risk and officially opened her "Home for Girls in honour of Blessed Vasyl

Velychkovsky". During this time of this unjust war, he brought more awareness to us of the great needs that now exist in Ukraine, for humanitarian help, for help for all the wounded, physically and psychologically. I thank all those who were able to support our fundraiser this weekend to support our military. Your help is much appreciated. Mary's Angels are once again being sold this year to support the war effort in Ukraine.

This weekend we also commemorate the Holodomor - the forced famine in the winter of 1932-33 which caused between 7 to 10 million Ukrainians to starve to death. We should pray for the conversion of the world that such human atrocities stop happening. Only Christ can conquer the evil that has caused such events. Let us remember all those victims of the Holodomor and pray for peace in Ukraine today.

As you see in our bulletins, every morning the Fathers offer the Divine Liturgy for some particular intention, be it for health, for blessings or for the deceased. The Divine Liturgy is a very powerful source of God's grace for any particular intention. Over the past several years there has been a decline from those requesting a particular intention during a Divine Liturgy. I wish to encourage you to consider offering Divine Liturgies for your needs. Now that we have three priests who can offer liturgies for these intentions, you can be assured that they will be prayed for in a timely fashion.

This week is perogy making week. Please come and volunteer. The help is needed and it is a great time for fellowship and community. I'm still looking for people that will make Coffee Klatch possible in the near future. Please step forward and we will organize it.

# Feast of Saint Andrew November 30

On November 30th we celebrate the Apostle Andrew the First-Called. St. Andrew gets this title since he is one of Jesus' first followers, having departed from being a follower of John to Baptist

to join Christ. Besides being the first disciple of Jesus, we recognize St. Andrew for leading his brother, St. Peter, to Christ.

St. Andrew is particularly venerated in the Eastern Churches. This is because he went eastward to preach the word of God. Tradition is that St. Andrew through the grace of the Holy Spirit saw the lands of Ukraine/Kieven Rus and blessed it, and foretold that many golden-domed churches would be build their for the glory of God.
