Dear Parishioners:

We have entered the season of Pre-lent. The church offers us five Sundays to prepare us for the journey of Great Lent, our preparation for Holy Week and Easter. This year Easter arrives early on March 31. I have reintroduced the "sign posts" from times past. They contain the theme for each Sunday and point in the direction of the icon of Resurrection behind the altar. These themes offer us the attitudes and dispositions which we need to

make spiritual progress. If we are not progressing in our spiritual journey to fullness of life in Christ, then we are digressing. We cannot just stand still. We began last Sunday with the theme of "desire". We need to want to see - experience - God, to get to know Him deeper, to live a more dedicated life to God and others, if we are to make this spiritual journey. This Sunday the theme is "humility" from the parable of the Pharisee and the Publican. The first saw himself as justified before God, although he was only self-absorbed. The other knew he was a sinner and was unworthy of encountering God. He asked God for mercy. Jesus says that this only became justified in the eyes of God.

On this journey we need to be humble before God, knowing that we are in desperate need for His mercy.

Today we begin Coffee Klatch after the 9 am and 11 am Divine Liturgies. Come downstairs for a time of fellowship. It is important that we meet each other and learn about each other's lives and concerns. Hopefully I will have a sign up sheet available for volunteers.

Most of our community is off to Saskatoon for Bishop Michael Smolinski's ordination to the episcopacy.

Just a few words about our church. The parish is our spiritual home. It has its strictly spiritual elements, the times for prayer and service. But it is also a home for our church community, a place of fellowship, a place of meeting and friendships, a place where we work together, a place where we organize ourselves to help others. We belong to the Archeparchy and thus also form a community with other Ukrainian Catholics in the city. Our church building's exterior and interior also has many needs and should be the responsibility of all of our parishioners, each contributing according to their abilities.

There are countless little things that need to be accomplished. In other words, our church community needs help. Please step up and offer some time and energy to the building up of our church community.



Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee Second Pre-Lenten Sunday

This Sunday marks the second week of preparation for Great Lent with the parable of the Publican and the Pharisee. The story is familiar—heard this time every year—yet each time we hear it, we have an opportunity to see

our selves through a new light. How can this be? This is the power of parables. Parables (like fables) allegorically represent a moral lesson. They present a short simple clear event, easy to visualize and remember. But behind the literal story lies the depth of human experience. The fictional characters symbolize human relationships in the presence of God; they teach us, through Christ, how we are to act as members of the Kingdom of heaven. Thus, a parable has the power to speak to every individual's personal experience every time afresh.

In case the lesson of Zacchaeus last Sunday, (where followers of Jesus grumbled at His choice of dining with a tax-collector), was too subtle, this Sunday gives us another chance to focus on our self-righteousness.

In this story, the figures behave in an opposite way to expectations. The Pharisee is supposed to be the good guy, but he is arrogant, self-obsessed, self-righteous, judgemental; whereas the Publican, who should be the bad-guy, is in fact the model for us: humble, contrite, sincere in his prayer—which in the East becomes the prayer of our breath—"Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner."

The meaning of this parable for me in my life today may be different than the impact it has on you at this particular time. As we reflect, we and detect ever greater significance relevance. Both Pharisee and Publican are stereotypes (think hypocritical politician/honourable thief). How often do we judge individuals according to surface: status, skin colour, ethnicity, etc.? Might we trust the elegantly dressed person but grip our wallet tightly as we walk by the homeless person huddled at the entrance of the local supermarket? How often do we judge (self-righteously) without realizing it? While we might want to relate to the Publican, repentance may not be easy to do. Living a Christian commitment needs constant self-vigilance. The love for others that Jesus exemplified is as radical as it is beautiful.
