

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we begin the journey of the Great Fast. It is inaugurated with the service of Forgiveness Vespers celebrated Sunday evening. These next 40 days are very important for our spiritual growth. We can either embrace them or ignore them. They are given to us as a gift to help us mature as followers of Christ. In the pre-lent period we were given several theme to help us on the journey:

Desire, Humility, Coming Home, Love and Forgiveness. They are before us in the church to keep reminding us to review our lives accordingly. Great Lent asks us to uncover our brokenness, our sinfulness, our distance from God. It is only by seeing ourselves truly for who we are with all of our failings and struggles that we are then able to submit these before our Lord for healing and restoration. Various prayer services are offered to us to help us on this journey. During Forgiveness Vespers we walk into Lent with the change of the altar cloths, a change of music tonality and an opportunity to forgive each other. On Monday the 1st day of the Great Fast (a strict fast day) we celebrate a Poklony service, a service of prostrations, asking our Lord to open our hearts and lead us on the road of repentance. On Wednesdays we will celebrate the beautiful Pre-sanctified Liturgy, a communion service in the context of Vespers. We humbly come before the Eucharist Christ and have Him strengthen us on the journey. If you have never attended this service in the past, I highly encourage you to come and experience its beauty. On Fridays and Sundays we will meditate on the Passion of Christ through the Way of the Cross.

Since it is forgiveness Sunday, it is a time to exchange mutual forgiveness in our families and in our church family. I both ask for your forgiveness for whatever I may have done to hurt you or in what ways I have failed to serve you. I also offer you my forgiveness. Forgiveness is a necessary step for healing and for spiritual growth. Let us sincerely exchange this gesture.

Coffee Klatch is going well. Thank you for all that are organizing it and participating in it. This week is Perogy Bee. We need volunteers Tuesday and Wednesday morning. Please come for this great fundraiser and for fellowship.

Cheesefare ~ Fogiveness Sunday Fifth Pre-Lenten Sunday

This is the final Sunday preparing us for the period of Great Lent: tomorrow begins what are to be the most intense weeks of the year dedicated to reflection, penance, and reconciliation. As we are about to plunge into Lent, the lessons of the prior weeks reappear today in fresh forms, ensuring that we are equipped with all the safety features

available to keep us from drowning.

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that we have fallen out with God—as Adam and Eve had in the Garden. Sinfulness obscures our knowledge of God. But our contemplation of our shortcomings, troubles, sorrow, is imbued with the hope and joy of the Resurrection.

Hence, this **Sunday of the Expulsion from Paradise**, is also known as **Forgiveness Sunday**. Last Sunday's parable told us that our interaction with others, even the most destitute, are interactions with Christ. Today we are reminded that God's forgiveness is manifest in our forgiveness of each other.

Forgiveness, truly forgiving one another is a powerful force against isolation, division, opposition, hatred—in short, the wages of sin. In the words of A. Schmemman: "To forgive is to put between me and my "enemy" the radiant forgiveness of God Himself."

Most often, Great Lent is associated with fasting. This Sunday is called "Cheesefare" because traditionally this would be the last day for eating any dairy products until Easter Sunday. Last Sunday, "Meatfare" marked the day to stop meat. The practice of abstinence from foods is intended to help us refocus our attention to our relationship with God. Stepping outside of our comfort zone with something as normal (and essential) as our eating habits is one way of changing our perspective towards our way of being. However, significantly, the readings from our prelenten Sundays repeatedly tell us that we are not to flaunt our fasting, make others uncomfortable with it, nor judge the practice of others. Fasting in our Faith Tradition is not a goal in itself. Fasting has only one goal: to help us focus on Christ so that we reflect His Spirit. As Paul told the Galatians, "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (5: 22-23). If fasting doesn't help us be better people, it has no virtue in itself.

These lessons from the prelenten Sunday Liturgies are fundamental to our very existence as human beings—as people with a desire to live with meaning and purpose. I cannot imagine a human interaction, be it at home or work, school, or in a crowd, that isn't informed by the parables of this period: essentially, let's live in love. On what will we base every action, decision, choice, as we move through each day? Will we care for how we look to others? Or will we care about others?
